"The name Korah is intertwined with the sin of rebellion.

They opposed the leaders appointed by God. Ungrateful for the privileges already granted them, they attacked the men who were over them in the Lord. Moses was right. Going against the leaders was going against God.

Again, Jude observed the same characteristics in people around him 1,500 years later – they "reject authority and speak evil of dignitaries" (v8, NKJV). This is the way of the world. Don't let it be your way, for it certainly isn't the path of the godly. "Let every soul be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God" (Rom 13:1, NKJV)."

Historical Summary

Korah led a rebellion against Moses and Aaron. The Lord judged them by opening up the ground, into which they fell alive.

Remarkably, Psalms 42, 49, 84, 85, 87, and 88 are attributed to the sons of Korah, which gives evidence to the fact that they overcame the failure of their ancestor and were marked by faithfulness, as worshippers of God.
